HEALTH & SAFETY CORNER

Essential Information for Driving in Bad Weather Conditions

<u>Vision</u>—Through the winter months dazzle from the low winter sun can be a particular problem.

Improve vision significantly by making sure that your windscreen is clean – inside and out. Use air conditioning for faster demisting and to reduce condensation on cold windows.

Check windscreen wipers and replace if necessary. Make sure that wipers are switched off in the park position when leaving the car when there is a risk of freezing as failure to do so could damage the blades or wiper motor when you turn the ignition on if the blades have frozen to the screen.

Windscreen washer fluid should be topped up and treated with a proprietary additive to reduce the chance of freezing in frosty weather.

<u>Visibility</u>—Check that all bulbs are working and that headlights are clean and aimed correctly.

You must use headlights when visibility is seriously reduced. You may also use front or rear fog lights but these must be switched off when visibility improves as they can dazzle other road users and obscure your brake lights.

Tyres—Check all tyres for condition and pressure. Get up at least 10 minutes earlier to give you time to prepare your vehicle.

Don't drive off like a tank-commander, with a tiny hole cleared in your windscreen. Clear all windows of snow and ice using a scraper and de-icer.

Put safety before punctuality when the bad weather closes in. While it's always a good idea to allow extra time in winter for your journey, drivers must accept the inevitability of being late for work if they are caught up in an unexpected delay.

<u>**Driving on Icy Roads**</u>—Gentle manoeuvres are the key to safe driving.

Select second gear when pulling away, easing your foot off the clutch gently to avoid wheel-spin.

Leave as much room as possible between you and the car in front.

Always apply brakes gently. Release them and declutch if the car skids.

AILIN CAGNEY AWARD

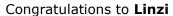

SLIPS, TRIPS & FALLS

Slips, Trips & Falls on Wet Floors:-

Are you washing / mopping floors when the client or public are still around !!!!!!!

STOP NOW & TALK TO YOUR SUPERVISOR IMMEDIATELY.....

If you have to wash a floor:-

The area to be washed must be cordoned off from client staff / the public.

Signs or barrier tape must be used to isolate the area.

Clean floors when the client/public are not present (after business hours).

Get assistance from a second person to clean and block a specific area and inform and direct the client / public around the danger.

Change the process (don't use water, use a buffer).

Use a scrubber dryer.

Wear sensible footwear.

Make sure the floor area is **fully** dry before leaving an area.

To Summarise:

Use Signs! Change the Process! Change the Time of Cleaning! Don't Use Water! - Talk to the Client.

CHRISTMAS WAGES ARRANGEMENTS

Please note the following in relation to wages payments during the Christmas Period.

Fortnightly Paid Staff

Wages for hours worked fortnight ending Sunday 22nd December 2013 will be in bank accounts on Tuesday 24th December 2013.

Wages for hours worked fortnight ending Sunday 5th January 2014 will be in bank accounts as normal on Thursday 9th January 2014.

Weekly Paid Staff
